
### MPOs - Mission

- •Supervises/plans for programming of Federal surface transportation funds
- Metropolitan Planning Process:
  "Continuous, Cooperative and Comprehensive" transportation planning
- •Provides technical assistance and planning analysis, studies, plans, etc.


### MPOs

- Census defined urbanized areas >50,000 population
  - ~420 nationwide (as of 2010 census)
  - ~182 are TMAs (>200,000 pop.)

### MPOs in NY




### MPO General Operational Structure










Feasibility of PRT in Ithaca, New York

### Outcomes – Lessons Learned

- ■PRT in Ithaca-Connect Ithaca strategy:
  - -Ithaca as PRT academic hub
  - -Ithaca as demonstration site
    - Topography & Weather
    - Willing land owners
    - Short distance O's & D's
- ■No Takers

### Lessons Learned

- ■Need for top down support.
- Technology and implementation too big for bottom up grassroots effort (particularly in a small city)
- Need champions at all levels.

### Four Observations/Suggestions

- Concern: ATN/PRT Remains a non-option when considering projects for funding
- Insert ATN/PRT in Federal Transportation Legislation – Define and Fund ATN/PRT

### Observations and Suggestions

- Sell it: Get & maintain ATN/PRT front & center
  - Capture the Imagination
  - -ATN/PRT as real option
  - Attention to: Message and Public Perception

### Observations and Suggestions

- Search for strategic allies in leadership & decision makers
  - Federal and State level big public money
  - Private sector corporate leaders
